SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

11. STANDARD SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing instructions No. 1 to 10 are contained within this year's Belfast Lough Yachting Conference Regatta Programme and are applicable to this Regatta.

12. MARKS

Marks for all Races

- Nos. 1 and 4 - Round Yellow Marks
- No. 2 - 6' Yellow inflatable
- No. 3 - Cloughan Jetty Green Buoy
- 'A' and 'B' - 1 Metre high Orange Inflatables with respective letter on each.

13. STARTING / FINISHING LINE

- 13.1 There will be two buoys, 1 metre high yellow drums (Inner and Outer), will be positioned approximately in line with an orange Standard, erected in front of the Clubhouse.
- 13.2 The Starting & Finishing Line is a transit of a line from the Standard through the Outer buoy. When starting & finishing, boats shall pass between the inner and the outer buoy..

14. COURSES FOR AFTERNOON RACES

14.1 The course to be sailed by each Class is as follows:-

- Race Nos. 1 - 6 - One round Long Course & Two rounds Short Course
- " 7 - One round Short Course & Two rounds Dinghy Course
- " 8 - Two rounds Dinghy Course
- " 9 & 10 - Three rounds Dinghy Course
- " 11 - Two rounds Short Course & One round Dinghy Course

14.2 Port or Starboard-hand courses will be indicated by the display of a red or green (respectively) board on the Battery, from the preparatory signal for each Class.

14.3 After starting, the following marks shall be rounded (see overleaf):-

Long Course – Port	4(p) – 3(p) – 2(p) – 1(p) – Finish Line
Long Course – Starboard	1(s) – 2(s) – 3(s) – 4(s) – Finish Line
Short Course – Port	4(p) – 2(p) – 1(p) – Finish Line
Short Course – Starboard	1(s) – 2(s) – 4(s) – Finish Line
Dinghy Course – Port	4(p) – B(p) – A(p) – 1(p) – Finish Line
Dinghy Course – Starboard	1(s) – A(s) – B(s) – 4(s) – Finish Line

15. DISCLAIMER

Each owner shall accept full responsibility for the management and safety of a competing boat and shall accept that neither the Organising Authority, Race Committee nor any of their members, employees or representatives bear any responsibility for any loss, damage or injury to persons, property or boats which may occur in connection with this regatta.

16. INSURANCE

The owner shall further declare that a valid and current Certificate of Insurance is held which will provide cover whilst racing, and will continue to do so for the duration of the regatta.

In addition to the starts for the Classes shown in the BLYC Handbook races for the following Classes will be provided, starting at the times shown.
